Session Makeup – Each session will include:

- ♦ A panel discussion among key stakeholders and facilitators on successes and failures, key learnings and recommendations and the way forward post Covid-19.
- \* These will be special sessions featuring interactions with key government figures.

### SERIES II - SECTOR-SPECIFIC SESSIONS



**IIFCL Projects Limited** 

This series will cover energy, transportation and urban infrastructure. Each session will be for about 75-120 minutes. The key outcome will be a list of suggestions/steps/measures that are needed to fast-track infrastructure development.



Session Makeup – Each session will include:

- \* One baseline presentation and one additional presentation.
- \* A panel to discuss the policy and regulatory issues, examine the successes and failures, and identify next steps.
- The panel will represent key stakeholders including the government, concessioning authorities, developers, EPC contractors, investors and consultants.

### SERIES III - STATE-LEVEL INITIATIVES

This series will consist of separate sessions with five to six states. The selection of states will depend partly upon the interest of the state in participating, the level of opportunity presented and its policies and programmes. In the opening session, we will also have a presentation on a comparative analysis of infrastructure development in states, focusing on both opportunities and challenges facing state-led projects. This series will be organised in association with IIFCL Projects Ltd.

Session Makeup – Each session will include:

- ♦ A presentation by the state on new initiatives to develop infrastructure (during and post Covid-19), focusing on opportunities for developers, contractors, investors and consultants.
- \* Interaction among delegates and a top government figure.
